1 Miyajima-ike Shinsui Park

He was a renowned geographer and surveyor who was born in Kujukuri. He created Japan's first surveyed map, the "Dainihon Enkaiyochi Zenzu."

9 Kotaro Takamura

"Chidori to Asobu Chieko" Poetry Monument
A passage in "Chieko" (Portrait of Chieko) reads "Kujukuri-no-shoka (Early summer in Kujukuri)." The monument is located behind the People's Inn: Sunrise Kujukuri.

Jitaku Meguro was a prominent Confucian scholar at the end of the Tokugawa shogunate. He left Edo, and taught a number of pupils in this area.

10 Monument to the Birthplace of Sweet Potato Cultivation in the Kanto Region

Attempts to produce sweet potatoes succeeded in the Kanto Region for the first time in 1735, which saved the farmers from starvation.

3 Hamanashi(Rugosa Rose) colony

Blooming Period: Around June
These were discovered growing wildly in 1972 in the Hosoyashiki-naya area. In early summer, they produce beautiful, purple, five-petaled flowers.
